Cara's Story

My name is Cara Ritmiller, and I am 31 years old. I was born on a military base in Washington state and moved to Pennsylvania when I was 6. When I was a little girl, my parents separated. My dad started drinking heavily and became sexually abusive. When I was about 12, I started to act out and it became very hard for my mother to deal with all my issues. My grades plummeted quickly, and I began having angry outbursts. Due to the abuse from my past, as a young teenager I began looking for love in all the wrong places and remember thinking if I could just find a nice guy, he could save my life. By the age of 16 I started drinking and smoking marijuana. In my late teens my dad moved away to Florida, and I never physically saw him again.

Unfortunately, because of the trauma I faced with my dad while growing up, I had a lot of unhealed wounds and turned to drugs to cope. When I was 19, I started I.V. Cocaine use and was pregnant with my first child at the age of 20. I was clean for the duration of my pregnancy, but afterwards I started using heroin, and at 22 I had my second child. I was incarcerated for about a month while I was pregnant and on the methadone program. I did well for a couple of years and even got my first house. However, on my daughter's 3rd birthday I found out my father passed away. It was at this time that I hit one of the hardest rock bottoms in my life, with no hope in sight and feeling completely helpless.

After the loss of my father, I lost my home and both of my children weren't with me. My addiction only got worse. I would try and use any drug I could get my hands on, and I even started selling my body for money and drugs. In 2017 my son's dad died from an overdose and his family took our son, Eli. Later that same year, the drug task force arrested me for possession with the intent to deliver heroin. In July of 2022, after years of verbal abuse, I left a man I was in a relationship with when he attacked me in front of my children. I remember how sad, alone, and unsafe I was at that time in my life. I called my pregnancy support person, and she asked me if I would want to go to New Life and I immediately said yes! Shortly after I was on the phone with Rachel, the Director of New Life for Mothers and Children, and she welcomed me with open arms.

I've been here at the Introduction Center since Aug 2, 2022. I am taking classes and am currently in the Omega phase of the program. God is doing miracles in my life. I have both of my children with me, and I have received healing I never thought was possible. God is truly Good!!
