My name is Charda Glover. I am 39 years old and I was born and raised in Lancaster, PA. I am the mother of five children ages 18,16, 13, 8 and 1 years old. I was raised by my grandparents in a loving home and grew up going to Ebenezer Baptist Church. As a child I attended a Christian summer camp, an after school program, and went to Sunday school with my sisters, one being my twin. When I was old enough to understand, my Nanny had sat my sisters and I down and explained why we lived with her and my pappap. It turned out my parents were in their own mess and thought it would be better for my grandparents to raise us. I was too young to understand how bad it was but my parents were both addicts. My grandparents raised us so that we didn't go into the system and get separated. At the age of 21 I had my first drink. I didn't care too much for that kind of life, so I would only have a drink occasionally. In 2018 my mommy passed away and her funeral was held on my birthday. I wasn't sure how to grieve, so I did what I knew she would have done; just like that I became what I never wanted to be, an alcoholic. I never wanted to be an alcoholic like my mommy but it just came so naturally. My life continued to spiral until I could no longer control anything any longer. In 2023 my children were taken away from me and that's when I knew something had to give. I would do anything for them and my love for them made me want to fight for them. With a sober mind and tears in my eyes I said yes and came to NLFMC and through the many prayers and tears my children came back. Life is never a straight and easy path. Sometimes we have to take the long, hard road but with God by my side I can overcome anything. I am grateful the Lord saw fit to save me. I am still here today because I have a purpose, a voice, and I matter. Thank you.
